In 2009, Amara found homes for 65 vulnerable children in our community and we served more than 400 families.

We are pleased and proud of the growth this represents over our 2008 results:

- 27% more children placed in homes
- 47% more siblings placed in homes together
- 94% more children of color placed in homes

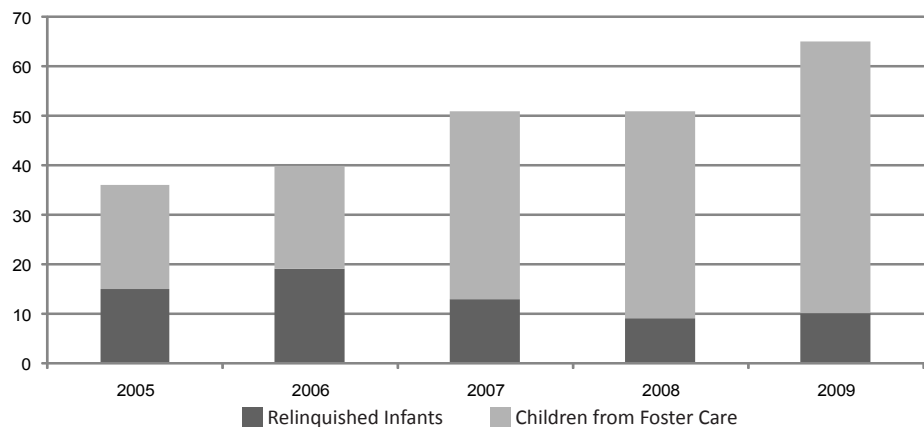
